Informational obligation on reducing the risk of spreading viruses, including the SARS-CoV-2 virus causing the COVID-19 disease, other infectious diseases and emergencies caused by them

Pursuant to Article 13 (1) and (2) of the General Data Protection Regulation of 27th April 2016, Journal of Laws UE L 119 of 4.05.2016 (further: the GDPR), we hereby inform that:

- 1. your personal data shall be processed by the Data Controller, i.e. the Medical University of Gdańsk with registered seat at M. Skłodowskiej Curie 3a 80-210 Gdańsk, represented by the Rector;
- 2. The Data Controller has appointed the Data Protection Officer who can be contacted in all matters regarding the processing of personal data via following e-mail address: iod@gumed.edu.pl;
- 3. Your personal data will be processed in regards to the measures taken to counteract the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19) and guaranteeing the safety of all people staying on the premises of the Data Controller;
- 4. Personal data is processed on the basis of art. 6 sec. 1 letter d) of the GDPR the necessity of processing to protect the vital interests of the data subject or another natural person; art. 9 paragraph 2 letter of the i) GDPR processing is necessary for reasons of public interest in the area of public health; art. 6 sec. 1 letter c) of the GDPR the necessity of processing to fulfil the obligation resulting from legal provisions, in particular, Art. 17 of the Act of 2nd March, 2020 on special solutions related to the prevention, counteraction and combating the COVID-19, other infectious diseases and crisis situations caused by them (Journal of Laws of 2020, item 374) the so-called special purpose Act;
- 5. Your personal data can be disclosed only to the employees authorised by the Data Controller to process personal data, processing entities under the entrustment agreement and other entities authorised under the law, in particular the respective services of the Chief Sanitary Inspector;
- 6. Your personal data shall be stored until the implementation of the protective measures against the COVID-19 ceases;
- 7. You have the right to access your data, rectify them, delete them, limit their processing, the right to transfer data, to raise an objection, the right to withdraw consent at any time;
- 8. You have the right to lodge a complaint to the Personal Date Protection Office in the case when your data processed by the Data Controller is processed contrary to General Data Protection Regulation of 27th April 2016.
- 9. Providing your personal data is a condition necessary to enter the premises of the Data Controller. Failure to provide data means that it is not possible to enter the premises of the Data Controller.
